

Are your pets prepared for hurricane season?



**Hurricane season is upon us and preparing for our pets is an important task. The information below is information and tips for before and after a hurricane.**



**\*Remember, it's NOT too early to start NOW**

**General Dog/Cat Preparation Before the Storm:**

Prepare a pet survival supply kit that includes:

leashes, water dish, toys and litter pan

two-week supply of food, water, current medications with instructions, and treats for pet waste and cleaning, add newspaper, plastic bags, cleaners, cat litter and disinfectant. in ziplock bag, compile a list of emergency numbers, i.e. your local veterinarian, a friend or family member, Humane Society, and local shelters in case the pet gets separated from you during evacuation

**Remember, the kit should be in a waterproof container**

Additionally you should

**Have a carrier/crate for each pet and large enough for pet to stand and turn**

**For identification purposes, make sure each pet is wearing a collar with its current rabies tag attached.**

**Also attach to the pet's collar the phone number of a family member or friend not in the evacuation zone**

**Broward County now recommends a second method of identification such as the "MICROCHIP"**

**Be sure your pet is current on vaccinations, especially rabies**

**Spay or Neuter your pet to prevent pregnancy if it should escape or get lost**
