PRESURGICAL BLOODWORK: Blood work prior to surgery is routine in human medicine and nearly routine in many veterinary practices. Blood will be drawn the day of surgery so that the patient's body function can be assessed prior to surgery.

Anesthesia: We have the latest in technology in anesthesia monitoring. Our monitoring system will be able to capture your pet's heart rate and oxygen consumption. Anesthesia allows us to clean all the surfaces of the teeth and under the gum line without causing any discomfort to your pet.

Intravenous Catheter and Fluids: We place intravenous catheters in all patients undergoing a general anesthesia for their safety as well as administering fluids during surgery. Fluids aid in circulatory support and to eliminate anesthesia for quicker recovery.

Complete Dental Scaling & Polishing:

Inspection and assessment by our Veterinarians of tooth root surface, tooth mobility, sub-gingival calculus (tartar below the gum line) and periodontal pockets. This is followed by extensive water flushing of the mouth to remove plaque and food particles. An Ultrasonic Scaler is used to remove all tartar and calculus buildup on the teeth by ultrasonic action. A rinse is used to flush and clean the oral cavity. A fluoride paste, applied with a polishing cup, is used to polish the teeth to a high gloss, smoothing the tooth surface to help prevent plaque buildup.



*****Dental Radiographs:*** After examining the teeth, X-rays are a critical component of the dental examination. Full mouth X-rays enable the doctor to evaluate up to 70% of the tooth structure that is located below the gum line, not visible to the naked eye. Not only do the X-rays aid in detecting abnormalities but can confirm the need for extraction of teeth that are loose or badly infected prior to the tooth becoming painful to your pet.

***** Dental radiographs are available at an additional fee and a Doctor will alert you if your pet is in need of this service.***
